## Scope and Content

This collection contains two albums each measuring 6x8 and one scrapbook measuring 10x13 and featuring over 200 photographs and a variety of letters and postcards. The collection documents part of the life of Ethel Amelia Roop (1895-1994), educator, missionary, and nurse.

This collection is significant to Seventh-day Adventist history partially due to Roop's interactions with Seventh-day Adventist communities. Although Seventh-day Adventist Church leadership moved the denominational headquarters away from Battle Creek, Michigan in 1908, Seventh-day Adventists continued to study, work, and live in Battle Creek. Roop worked and studied with Seventh-day Adventists while attending the Battle Creek Sanitarium School of Nursing, and likely interacted with Adventists who served as missionaries in China and India.

## Biographical Information

Ethel Amelia Roop (1895-1994) was born in the US state of Maryland on November 27, 1895, to her parents William and Annie. William, a well-educated and active Church of the Brethren minister, made sure that his and Annie's children were well-educated. Ethel graduated from Western Maryland College in 1916, having taken its

Historical course of study as well as studying pedagogy and elocution. The writer for the caption in *The Aloha*, her college yearbook from 1916, noted that Ethel “enjoys laughing as much as she enjoys the joke” and described her as “[a]lways pleasant, [and] always studious...quiet and demure”. After graduation, she taught in local Maryland schools and then taught health education, history, and French at Elizabethtown College, a school run by the Church of the Brethren in Elizabethtown, Pennsylvania, for at least two school years between 1921 and 1923. The first album in the collection pertains to her time at Elizabethtown College.

The second album and the scrapbook are mostly related to her time at the Battle Creek College School of Nursing, run by John H. Kellogg. Roop worked at Battle Creek Sanitarium as a student nurse and graduated with a degree in nursing in the spring of 1925. This training included work at the Chicago Lying-In Hospital and medical missionary work in the city of Detroit. She then briefly attended Bethany Theological School (now Bethany Theological Seminary) for some training in theology. In 1926, Roop was called by the Church of the Brethren to serve as a missionary in India. She arrived in Bombay (now Mumbai) on September 30, 1926, and remained in India at the Brethren outposts in Bulsar (now Valsad) and Poona (now Pune) and then at the Dahanu Hospital north of Mumbai, working as a nurse and educator.

Illness forced Roop back to the United States late in 1929, arriving back in New York City on January 12, 1930. After a brief stay in a hospital, she returned home and worked as a nurse in the obstetrics department of Women’s Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland (which closed in the 1960s). She was a member of the Meadow Branch Church of the Brethren from age eleven onward, taught Sunday School, led out in Vacation Bible School, and was keenly interested in children’s ministries and personal ministries work. Roop died in her home state of Maryland on November 27, 1994.
