## **Scope and Content**

This collection contains diaries, journals, spending logs, photographic negatives, photo album, and glass slides belonging to Walter Konrad Wilhelm Ising (1881-1950). These materials are related to Ising's work as a Seventh-day Adventist missionary and church administrator in Germany, Lebanon, Egypt, Palestine, and the United States during the 1920s to the 1940s.

### Arrangement and Quantity

This collection is 4 linear feet and is arranged in three series.

### Custodial History and Immediate Source of Acquisition

This collection was donated to the Archives in 1987 by W. K. Ising's son, Konrad. Two additional items (a 1914 diary belonging to Arthur Grosvenor Daniells, Jr., and a manuscript by Liescheu Werner) were transferred out of this collection in 2022, as they were not related to the bulk of the collection.

#### **Biographical Information**

Walter Konrad Wilhem Ising was born 30 March 1881 in Danzig, Germany. In 1889, he and his sister traveled to the United States to attend school in Missouri. He returned to Germany in 1895. In 1903 he attended a Seventh-day Adventist camp meeting and met William A. Spicer, who at that time was secretary of the General Conference. In 1904, Ising was baptized into the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Berlin, Germany, and he began studies at the Mission Seminary in Friedensau. That same year, he was drafted into military service, and Ising refused to serve on the seventh-day Sabbath and was eventually arrested for this. In the end, the German military discharged him as physically unfit for military service, and Ising went back into church work, taking up an appointment as L. R. Conradi's personal secretary.

From 1905 to 1908, Ising served as secretary of the German Union Conference. During this time, Walter married Frieda Schlegel (1884-1966), a nurse and Bible worker. He also began editing the German paper Zions-Wächter. He was ordained in March 1908 in Hamburg, Germany. During that year, Ising was appointed to lead the Church's newly established mission station in the Middle East as director of the Syro-Egyption Mission. He, Frieda, and their daughter Dorothea arrived in Beirut, Lebanon in April 1908, where he taught Bible classes and studied Arabic. After a short while, he began to be strategic about his work, which took him throughout the region, including to Syria, Palestine, Arabia, and Mesopotamia, where he often worked among existing Christian groups, especially ones of German descent.

In 1913, Ising became the superintendent (what today would be called director) of the mission in Lower Egypt. Once established there, he took a trip to Iraq, while Frieda and their daughter traveled to London where Frieda was to study midwifery. When World War I broke out, Walter was interned in Egypt throughout the war's duration on the island of Malta, and Frieda worked as a nurse in England. They were not reunited until 1919, when both returned to Germany. According to his obituary in the Review, Walter never fully recovered from the poor treatment he received on Malta.

In July 1920, Walter Ising was elected secretary of the European Division, living first in Denmark and then in Switzerland. During this time, he visited the Middle East, particularly Es-Salt, Transjordan (today, As-Salt, Jordan). While the Isings were living in Switzerland, their son, Konrad, was born. Walter also wrote a book, *Among the Arabs in Bible Lands* (1924), and undertook a German translation of George McCready Price's 1917 *Q.E.D., New Light on the Doctrine of Creation*.

In 1928, the Isings were called back to the Middle East, where Walter became the superintendent of the Arabic Union Mission. In 1937, the Isings returned to Europe, where Walter served briefly as the secretary of the Central European Division; in 1938, the Isings moved to the United States, as Walter took up a position as associate secretary (today, associate director) of the General Conference Sabbath School Department. From 1946 to 1950, Ising worked as a General Conference field secretary and was responsible for at least part of the work of the Displaced Persons Committee, helping to relocate Europeans displaced by World War II. Walter Ising retired in 1950 and died later that year in Takoma Park, Maryland, United States on 23 September 1950.
